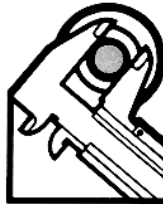

Crisis Case Corner

Case 1377

Investigators: R. Balcerzak – D. Vormelker
A St. Clair Shores couple had managed their living expenses while the husband earned \$10.00 per hour and the wife minimum wage. The wife, a mother of boys age 15, 13 and 9, is being treated for breast cancer and has not worked in five months. She has not received any SSD benefits and the family is behind on paying their bills. The Crisis Club paid their utilities, auto insurance and two mortgage payments. A trip to Meijer provided coats and shoes for the boys and food for the family.

Case 1379

Investigators: J. Oreson – D. Vormelker
A 51-year old former Grosse Pointe Crisis Club member has not worked after suffering a heart attack in 2006. He has since lost his home, moved into a motel and placed his belongings in storage. The SSD benefits, for which he applied, will commence in 30 days. The Crisis Club made payments to Walgreen's, to a storage facility and to the motel.

Case 1380

Investigators: R. Balcerzak – D. Vormelker
Compassion Pregnancy Center of Macomb County referred a client for help. The 43-year old mother of a six-month old daughter is receiving unemployment and had to move out of her one room apartment. The Crisis Club made the security deposit and one month's rent for a Harrison Twp. apartment.

Case 1381

Investigators: J. Oreson – D. Vormelker
St. Ambrose Parish referred a single Grosse Pointe Park woman in need. The 36-year old has emotional issues and also suffers chronic migraines. She recently lost a part-time job that supplemented her SSI and food stamps. The Crisis Club brought her utilities and rent up to date. NOTE: This write-up might seem short or scant however, please read the Thank You from this recipient and you'll understand how the little bit of help we give means so much to the people we help!

Case 1383

Investigators: R. Balcerzak – D. Vormelker
A 42-year old Detroit divorcee, who is being treated for breast cancer and unable to work, was referred through the Van Elslander Cancer Center. While she has moved into her mother's apartment her mother is unable to help with her car repairs and other personal needs. The Crisis Club had a local Grosse Pointe garage make the repairs and took her shopping at Meijer.

Case 1384

Investigators: R. Balcerzak – D. Vormelker
A Warren woman called the Club's Hot Line on the advice of a Warren policeman. She stated she quit work

to care for husband who was diagnosed with terminal liver cancer. Crisis Case Investigators scheduled an interview however, the husband unexpectedly died before the interview date. The deceased had life and mortgage insurance in place and thus, no further action was necessary.

Case 1385

Investigators: J. Oreson – D. Vormelker
Van Elslander Cancer Center referred an Oak Park family, including daughters age 13, 9 and 3. The 9-year old daughter has significant emotional issues and her problems have resulted in additional expenses on top of the mother's cancer treatment costs. The Crisis Club paid the families utilities, which were threatened to be shutoff.

Case 1386

Investigators: R. Balcerzak – D. Vormelker
A Roseville Elementary School principal asked our help for a family with four children in his school. The children's shoes were worn out and each child was in need of a winter coat. The mother was on unemployment and the family was facing utility shutoff notices. Her ex-husband was unable to continue support after being incarcerated. The Club paid the utilities and took the family to Meijer for food and clothes. The mother then received additional good news. Kroger called to tell her "You have passed your drug test and we are accepting your application for cashier training, MERRY CHRISTMAS".

Grosse Pointe Crisis Club

Thank you so much for the generous gift you have given to my family. To receive help with mortgage, utility bills and auto insurance has been a huge relief. The Meijer gift cards are more than I ever expected and will be put to good use with three growing sons. Thank you again for being so kind to my family and me as we fight this terrible disease. You truly do give people care and consideration.

A special thank you message intended to express warm appreciation for you're your thoughtfulness. Thanks so much for all you have done and my God bless you.

Case 1381

To Don and Everyone at the Grosse Pointe Crisis Club Thank you! I am a 36 yr. old woman living with bipolar disorder. This is a bio chemical imbalance of the brain, which causes mood swings ranging from extreme mania to devastating depression. I have experienced both and everything in between. After nine years, 18 doctors, 5 hospitals, 36 different drugs and a lot of cognitive therapy, I am relatively stable. The drugs cause many physical side effects, some which will be with me for the rest of my life. This is a trade off to keep me stable. I've suffered breakdowns, some of which require hospitalization and each time a part of the brain is permanently damaged. Financial stress is my #1 reason for breakdowns. It was 3 years ago when my illness really became so destructive. After an approved medical leave, strongly requested by my doctor for intensive treatment, I was released from my banking position. This was the beginning

of the most difficult time of my life. Every month the threat of eviction and loss of my vehicle caused intense highs and lows. It really took a toll on my body and brain. In 2008, I was declared legally disabled. One would think this was devastating, but for me it was a blessing. I'm always looking for work, but each time the same outcome, loss of stability after several months. Once again I'm left to pick up the pieces, get myself well and try again. Disability has enabled me to pay rent, have proper medical care and food to eat.

When Don visited my home and discussed my need for assistance, he was kind and caring. He did not interrogate me as many government agencies do. Not only did he help with my initial request, he did so much more. The Club's help has enabled me to clean up most of the financial problems I have been struggling with. This has lifted a great weight from my shoulders allowing some sound, sane piece of mind. I've recently applied for a few part-time positions at the DIA and a market. In closing I wrote a portion of my story so you knew who you were helping. Everyday there is a moment that I smile knowing the help I have received and how it has changed my life. Many people are not familiar with bipolar disorder and the devastation it causes the patient, friends and family. It is very real and only treatable—not curable. I wake up each day not knowing what is to be, but I can tell you on this sunny Saturday morning I feel alive and well. If you encounter one of us, know, more than likely, we are giving it all we've got to stay in balance. I will never forget the help I have received from the Club. It is about the only help I have ever asked for or received.

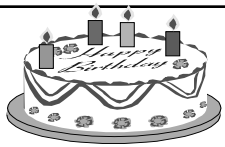
