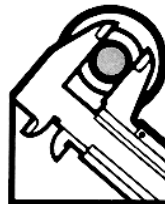

Crisis Case Corner

Case 1387

Investigators: B. Balcerzak – D. Vormelker

Christ The King Church, in Grosse Pointe Woods, referred a Harper Woods family to the Crisis Club for help. A 56-year old widow, and mother of three teenagers, works part-time at Wayne State Univ. She cannot make ends meet with a take home wage of less than \$700 a month. Both the furnace and stove in their home were irreparable. A heating contractor, also a Crisis Club member, was hired to install a new furnace and stove purchased by the Club.

Case 1388

Investigators: J. Oreson – D. Vormelker

A doctor and Crisis Club member referred a Rochester Hills couple ages 59 and 60. Both the husband and wife had debilitating disabilities and had undergone multiple surgeries over the past twelve months. They have applied for SSD, after using all their savings, and continue to receive whatever help their children can afford. The Crisis Club paid the storage bill for their personal belongings, as they had to move in with their daughter, and also provided Kroger certificates.

Case 1389

Investigators: J. Oreson – P. Blake

A 48-year old divorcee and mother of a 13-year old son, from Clinton Township, lost her job eighteen months ago. She receives food stamps and is living with a friend until she finds work. Investigators took her shopping to Meijer, mainly for clothes, shoes, boots and personal items for her son.

Case 1390

Investigators: D. Vormelker – B. Balcerzak

A Grosse Pointe Woods mother of three children, ages 12, 9 and 5, lost her husband in an automobile accident. The widow was left with no savings and presently has no job. She has applied for SSD that should start in a month. Your Crisis Club paid her rent, including late fees, and brought her utilities up to date.

Case 1391

Investigators: B. Balcerzak – D. Vormelker

A 35-year old Detroit woman is in treatment for cancer. A social worker from the Van Elsander Cancer Center is assisting her in applying for available assistance. In the interim, her mother moved in with her to help with living expenses. The Crisis Club paid her DTE bill to avoid a shut-off.

Case 1392

Investigators: P. Blake - B. Balcerzak

A couple of Crisis Club members assisted an acquaintance who was unable to work after falling from a tree. The 52-year old bachelor from Harsens Island continues to convalesce while healing fourteen broken ribs

and a punctured lung. He had no health insurance and spent his savings to pay doctor and hospital expenses. While the Crisis Club could not help him with his four late mortgage payments the Club did bring his auto loan and insurance premiums up to date.

Case 1393

Investigators: B. Balcerzak - R. Sulkowski

This case was also referred from a Crisis Club member. The 48-year old widow has, for years strived to properly raise her three children. All three are pursuing a college education and are as determined as their mother to survive. We could not help her from losing her home as she was behind five mortgage payments however, the Club did purchase new tires for her 15-year old Pontiac to enable her to safely drive forty miles to one of her three jobs. Meijer gift cards for food and clothes were also provided.

Case 1387

Dear Members of the Crisis Club,
Words cannot express how grateful we feel for everything you have done for us. If you had not fixed our furnace we would have been without heat for the second year. We still cannot believe we have heat, and every time it is on we are filled with joy. The house is warm and cozy. It feels sooooo wonderful. When I saw the stove you got for us, I could not believe my eyes. I cried from happiness and gratitude. Without you we would be without a stove for the holidays. That would have been so sad.

Things have never been easy. My husband was diagnosed with leukemia when I was pregnant with our third child. Within one year he passed away. I became very depressed. My support, my anchor was gone and the weight of the world was on my shoulders. Emotionally, I felt homeless. I found myself alone with three children (five year old Adam, three year old Natalie and six month Nicole). Without any extended family, without any protection or support, life became very hard. I was doing my best to keep us afloat. We never went on vacation; we never had cell phones. We stuck to the very basics. In order to save money I was doing everything possible myself, and later with the help of the children as they grew. We painted the house, took the carpets off and sanded and painted the floors. There were some things that were beyond our abilities; like replacing the pipes to the septic tank or repairing the roof. Those additional unavoidable expenses put a strain on our very tight budget. We ended up with unpaid property taxes and our furnace and cooking stove broke. I was overwhelmed with problems that kept piling up. You are our angels that came and rescued us in our time of need. I want you to know that along with the tangible things you gave me much more. With your kindness and generosity you lifted up my heart. You gave me hope and courage. I can never thank you enough.

Case 1388

We would like to express our most sincere "THANK YOU" for everything you've done for us. With everything that has happened lately you helped in a variety of ways to make our challenges bearable. Again our most sincere "THANK YOU" and God bless you all.

Case 1393

This letter is for the men who came to my home last month.

I don't know you guys. Someone referred me to your

organization and said you were a private group of 'philanthropists' who seek out people in need, listen to their story, and try to lend a hand to someone in need. I am a health care worker and have been a single parent just about my whole life. I have 3 children. Last year I lost a job I was at for 5 yrs. Due to the economy/job cutbacks. I have never been unemployed, never collected an unemployment check, never have been one to "ask" for help, til last year.

During my life I have struggled. I pushed my kids hard to go to school (college) and be strong, independent and self-sufficient. This has always been a huge priority in my life, and as a result, my oldest son (now 26) graduated last year with a dual degree in computer science and biology. My middle daughter (age 20) is at Western for nursing/pharmacy, and my youngest daughter (age 18) is attending Macomb for her pre-req's for teaching. We are trying to get her to Bethel or some other Christian universities to further her education.

I don't think your corporation wants my whole life story, but I wanted to give you just a little more detail because you don't even know us but what you did do was well...I can't explain in words what you did for me. Currently I am working 3 jobs to make ends meet. I bought my 1st home 5 years ago and because I had to live on unemployment for 6 months last year, it was a huge setback for us financially. I had put almost my whole life savings and credit out there to keep my kids in school. I have debt, due to that and probably always will. But I have been able to find work these last 3 months and get help, as a "hardship case" with keeping my bills up to date. I got credit counseling and pay that regularly. I guess the hardest part was making sure my OLD car was gonna make it to work, and trying to keep food in the fridge. With my house, I am 5 payments behind but I have hope that my tax refund this year will help keep us here, that's another story.

Anyhow here's where the miracle came in. Larry Hakim called you and your 2 men paid me a visit. I was nervous as hell, I can tell you that. I had never been good with talking or asking anyone for help. I don't know how to talk about my life struggles. I just always searched for ways to get things taken care of, no matter what and put my kids first, put their education the priority, no mater what.

Well, you guys listened to me at my kitchen table and the next day, you called me and told me to meet you at a tire place, you were going to put tires on my car. The

next thing I know, you showed up at my house that night with some gift cards for Meijer.

Here I am getting these gifts from people I have only met ONE TIME. You have NO IDEA how blessed I have felt since then. I have been overwhelmed with your generosity. When I went to Meijer, I probably looked like a fool, because I cried in there after scanning that card knowing it came from complete strangers WHO DID NOT have any hidden agenda or expect me to repay any of it back.

When I drive now, I don't skid on wet roads. As I'm writing this, the snow is falling and I am working mid-nights at a hospital about 40 miles from here, and I'm not NERVOUS about my car skidding all the way there. Do you know how long it's been since I've felt security like that? I can't describe in words how it feels to have what you have given me. It's been about 2 weeks since you gave to me. I have not been able to put the pen to this paper because I do not know how to thank you guys without sounding "schmoozy" or whatever, I still don't know if my words can describe my gratefulness for what you did for me.

I am humbled by men like you. What you did, I could never express in words what this experience felt like.

You have made me feel safe in my car and you fed my family, and that's something I haven't been able to do too well for almost a year now. People like you, I didn't think even existed anymore.

I am telling you the truth, I have heard the words... "no"... "I'm sorry, but"... "we can't help you"... "there's no jobs", etc. for so long now, that to finally have some complete strangers actually do me a favor is just basically a miracle.

And you didn't make me feel guilty or poor or anything, you guys made me feel like somebody just held my hand for the first time in a VERY LONG TIME.

You took me and gave me a gift without any expectations, without making me feel like humiliated, without anything expected. You gave me hope, you gave me gratitude but most of all you just gave me some love, security, safety, comfort. How do I thank complete strangers? I don't know how to adequately thank you except to write it down, the best that I can, and I say a prayer of thanks to you.

So that's all, for now.

One day I will pass on what was so freely given to me. Someday, I hope to be in the position you are in, and give anonymously to someone like you did for me.

Thank you for the gifts. We are living proof that love still does exist. Your hearts are that of good people and I just can't thank you enough. God Bless you.

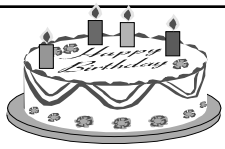
