Crisis Case Corner

Case #1908 D. Vormelker

A social worker from the Webber Cancer Center contacted the Club about a 60 year old married man who had very advanced cancer. Both he and his wife work full time. However his wife was in danger of losing her job due to excessive time off to care for her husband. They were struggling financially and requested assistance with their mortgage. The social worker was looking into any possible available financial assistance for them. Unfortunately, before the Club could set up an interview the client passed away and the social worker indicated no financial assistance was required at this time.

Case #1909 M. Norris - D. Vormelker

A Van Elslander Cancer Center social worker recommended a single woman who was diagnosed with stage 4 uterine cancer. She had not received her short term disability through work. She was facing possible eviction and has no history with eviction. The Club paid two month's rent to stop possible eviction and gave her Meijer gift cards for food and necessities.

Case #1910 M. Norris - D. Vormelker

A social worker from Orchards Children's Services contacted the Club about a single mother with four children who was in a domestic violence relationship. She left her ex-husband and relocated her family into a shelter. The oldest child passed away and they are working on survivor benefits. She is working two jobs trying to save towards relocating to stable housing for her family. She located a rental property in a gated community that she could afford but needs relocation expenses and gift cards to purchase household necessities. The Club paid the security deposit and first month's rent so she could relocate and gave her Meijer gift cards to purchase household items.
